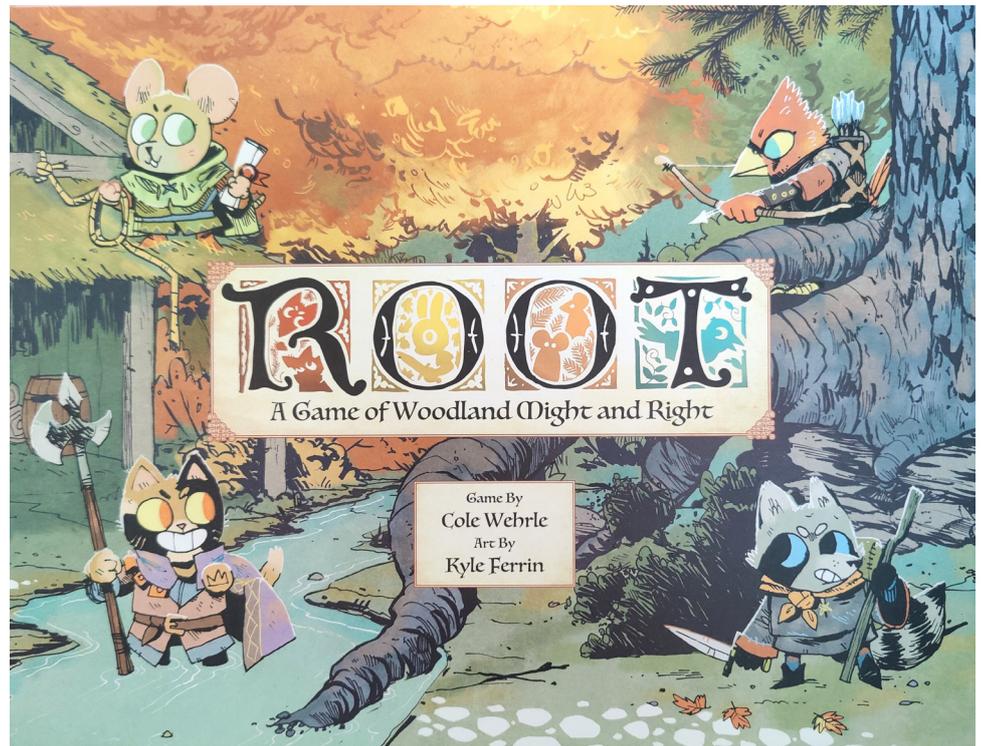

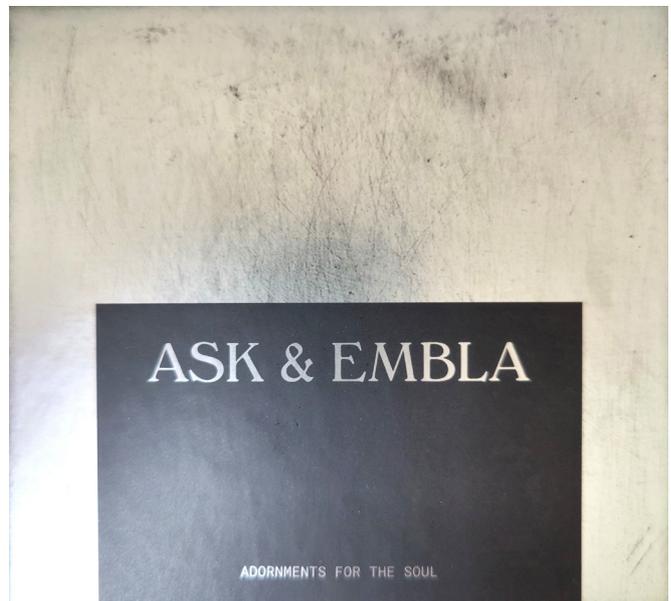

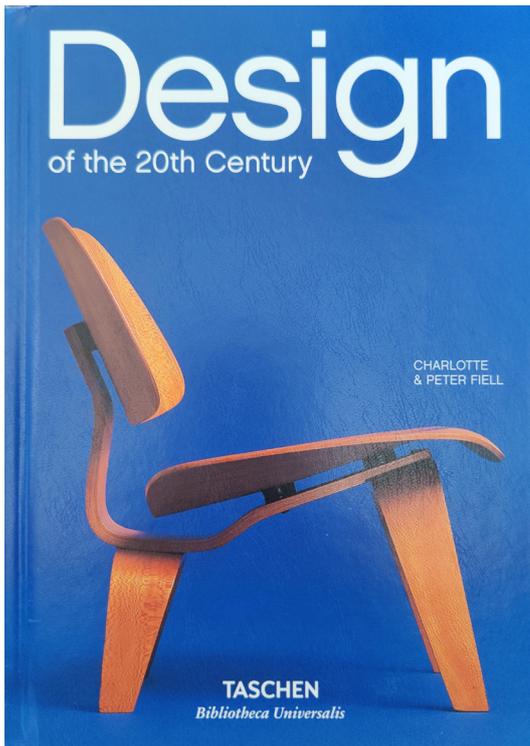




This is a box of vitamins. I really like how the letter for the vitamins disappears into the top white section.

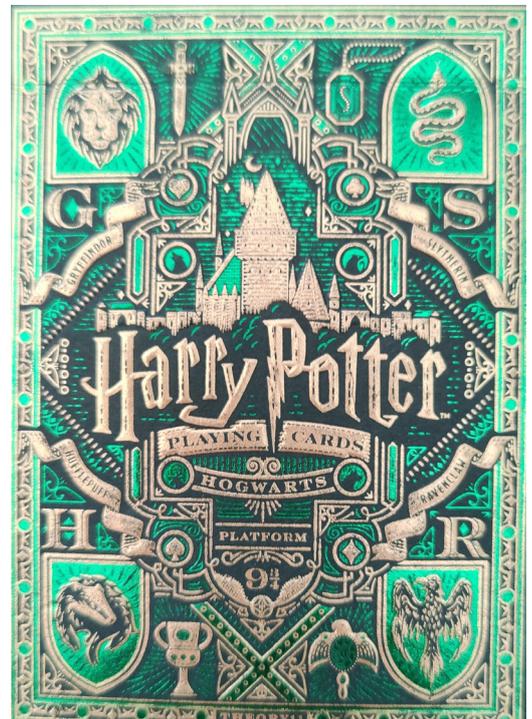
This is a sticker from an iFixit toolkit. Since it uses a composition that is akin to a 20th century propaganda poster, it immediately grabs your attention.
